PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION TO A SHRINERS BURN HOSPITAL

Admission to a Shriners Burn Hospital is essentially the same as to a Shriners Hospital for Children. Here, however, it must be stressed that timing may be of utmost importance. The final outcome of a burn case may be greatly dependent upon the type of treatment and the speed with which it can be started. Therefore in emergency, the Chief Surgeon has the authority to admit the patient, having the application completed at a later date. If then you know of an emergency burn case, immediately call the Shine Ambassador in the area. Let's not miss a chance to put out a helping hand. Be a true Shriner!



VETERAN OF THE MONTH

David Hill, Sergeant Major, USMC

David Hill enlisted in the United States Marine Corps in June, 1981 after following in the footsteps of his father and grandfather, both veterans of the USMC. He received his basic training at San Diego, and followed on with MP school at U.S. Army Post Fort McLellan, AL. Upon completion of training, David was assigned to Camp Pendleton, CA as a base MP.

After his stint in California, he was ordered to Iwakuni, Japan to work in Customs and Immigration, then returned again to Camp Pendleton where he was assigned to Force Service Support; the same unit his grandfather has served in during World War 2. He re-enlisted in 1986 and received orders to Marine Corps Air Station Tustin, Orange County, CA.

In 1987, Dave received a break, when he was ordered to Koneoha, HI as a base MP. His time in 'the worst job I had in the Corps' was soon over, as he received orders in 1988 to Korea and a part of Team Sprit. It is there he served until his discharge from active duty in 1990.

After his service, Dave came back to Fort Wayne and began working at North American Van Lines. During this time he also received his ASE Master Mechanic licensing as a student at Ivy Tech. In 1994, Dave took a position at the United States Postal Service, where he still serves today.

Having spent so much of his professional life in uniform, Dave returned to military service in 2003, joining the Indiana National Guard and Reserve/Indiana State Defense Force. The Force, which is voluntary and state-ran, serves as a Community Response Team, doing search and rescue, as well as processing troops for overseas service at Camp Atterbury before they serve in the Middle East. Dave holds the rank of Sergeant Major and is a Military Emergency Management Specialist.

Dave joined Three Rivers Lodge, and was raised to the degree of Master Mason in 1998, having served as Worshipful Master three times (1999, 2001, 2003). He transferred his membership to Highland Lodge, and is also a member of the Mizpah Shrine, Scottish Rite and York Rite bodies. He is a member of the Iron Camels and is also a Past Commander of the Legion of Honor.

Dave is married to the former Michelle Brownfield, and they have two children, Kenny and Stephanie. Michelle is a member of Teti Sheri Temple #60, Daughters Of The Nile, where she will be the Queen in 2018/2019.

Joseph A. Rockwell was born in Ann Arbor, MI in 1934, and upon graduation from Tri-State University, enlisted in the United States Air Force in 1954. He received his basic training at Lackland Air Force Base, San Antonio, TX and was then assigned to training at Lowrey Air Force Base, Denver, CO as a photographic repairman.

Upon completion of training, Joe was ordered to Kinross Air Force Base, MI and served in base operations until his discharge from active duty in 1958.

Joe worked in the automotive industry for years, having been in the sales, testing, development and project engineering teams for Chrysler. He was promoted to safety engineer for the Motor Vehicle Manufacturer's Association, and then returned to Chrysler as the chief design engineer at the Ottawa, KS truck plant. It was there that he finally retired from Quality Equipment where he was the developmental engineer.

Joe and his wife Peggy were married and raised two sons.

Joe was raised a master mason at Clinton Lodge #175, Clinton, MI in 1962. He moved to Sturgis, MI and then to Angola, IN, where in 1990 he became a member of Mizpah Shrine and subsequently the Legion of Honor. He has also served in the Car Club, Hillbilly Clan and the Hospital Unit. As a van driver, Joe has logged countless miles, having made over 120 trips and counting to both our Chicago and Cincinnati hospitals.
