PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION TO A SHRINERS BURN HOSPITAL

Admission to a Shriners Burn Hospital is essentially the same as to a Shriners Hospital for Children. Here, however, it must be stressed that timing may be of utmost importance. The final outcome of a burn case may be greatly dependent upon the type of treatment and the speed with which it can be started. Therefore in emergency, the Chief Surgeon has the authority to admit the patient, having the application completed at a later date. If then you know of an emergency burn case, immediately call the Shine Ambassador in the area. Let's not miss a chance to put out a helping hand. Be a true Shriner!



An Important Distinction

Our official mission is to "Provide the highest quality care to children with neuromusculoskeletal conditions, burn injuries and other special health care needs within a compassionate, family-centered and collaborative care environment ... This mission is carried out without regard to ... ability of a patient or family to pay.

Approximately 85 percent of the organization's multi-million dollar operating budget is spent in direct support of the organization's three-part mission of patient care, research and education.

Also, indicating we offer something for free implies we have the means to provide that item for free. It can be confusing to our donors to hear "free care" on the one hand, and we seriously need donations to fund our efforts on the other.

For many people, the phrase "free care" means charity care, which may be considered sub-standard. This is not a concept we want to be associated with; we want our patients to choose our hospitals because they believe they will receive the best care possible.

And finally, as we are accepting third-party pay, and insurance co-pays and deductibles from our patient families when possible, using the phrase "free care" is clearly incorrect.

Our Method, Not Our Mission, Has Changed

It is critically important that everyone use our official messages and phrasing. We must be able to communicate that while the way we conduct business has changed, our mission has not. It is imperative that we stress the expert, quality care provided at Shriners Hospitals for Children, rather than the cost. Continuing references to free care can lessen the value of our services in the minds of referring physicians and potential patients, and be detrimental to the clarity of our mission of improving the lives of children.

The name of the fraternity is Shriners International. The name of the philanthropy is Shriners Hospitals for Children. AAONMS is no longer used. Imperial Council has been replaced with Shriners International.
