PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION TO A SHRINERS BURN HOSPITAL Admission to a Shriners Burn Hospital is essentially the same as to a Shriners Hospital for Children. Here, however, it must be stressed that timing may be of utmost importance. The final outcome of a burn case may be greatly dependent upon the type of treatment and the speed with which it can be started. Therefore in emergency, the Chief Surgeon has the authority to admit the patient, having the application completed at a later date. If then you know of an emergency burn case, immediately call the Shine Ambassador in the area. Let's not miss a chance to put out a helping hand. Be a true Shriner!



The Radio unit is proud to announce we have begun using digitalized software and equipment in our HAM operations. This software brings an older mode of communication into today's new world of communicating all over the world using computers. The great thing is, we have at least two operators who are willing to provide a demonstration for you when you have a few minutes to spare, just for the asking. The software, using a standard communication and a base HAM radio can reach anywhere. For those more detail driven the software provides communications on exchange modes such as FT-8 and JT-65; and digital voice/conversation mode like PSK-31 and good old RTTY. Other possibilities are ahead and closer than you may realize. This is an exciting time for HAMs and the FCC is being more responsive to our community needs thru emergency communications in times of disasters.

Since the Hawaii volcano eruption on May 6th, about 1,000 HAM communications have occurred, including satellite and image transmissions to other parts of the world by HAMs. This is performed by HAM operators just like your brethren here atMizpah Shrine. Come join us in this exciting time in HAM communications.

Our unit meeting occur every third Tuesday year round (except for December) at the Shrine starting at 6:30pm. We gather around 5:30-5:45p for fellowship, drinks and food. You are welcome to join us.
