


### Etna Acres Golf ...

This year we had 24 foursomes participate in the Annual Joby's Fun Tournament held at Etna Acres Golf Course.



For most teenagers being voted queen would be the memory they carry forward from senior prom. But Jennessa, 17, from eastern lowa, will also remember her shoes thanks to care she received at Shriners Children's Chicago. The teen was able to wear the cute sneakers she hoped for when a childhood orthopedic condition threatened her footwear goals.

Pediatric orthopedic surgeons treated Jennessa for macrodactyly as a child, a condition where the toes and foot may develop bigger. In



2023, she returned to Shriners Children's with a new goal, to wear sneakers at prom.

Six months before the dance. Clark Schierle, M.D., Ph.D., used liposuction to remove extra tissue on her the foot. However, a rare infection put her fairy tale moment at risk. The team performed several procedures leading to successful skin graft. Jennessa was able to wear white sneakers to prom and was even crowned Prom Queen "I remember receiving a text that night in April and seeing pictures from prom. I was sobbing in my kitchen tears of joy thinking this is why Shriners Children's is amazing!" said Dr. Schierle.

Greetings Nobles from the Mizpah Legion of Honor Unit:

As we embark on this new year of 2024, it seems fitting to reflect on the past years that have been chaotic and uncertain in our country. This was certainly driven home by the new potentate (Aaron Murray) during a recent gathering. The same can be said for our new Mizpah Legion of Honor Commander, (Turner England Jr). He is reaffirming the basics at our first Stated Meeting in 2024.

This being said, it's also important to remember we are all being observed unknowingly, and our behaviors are being noted by someone on a routine / daily basis. All Shriner Nobles are leaders in maintaining respect for our flag and country. These commitments need to be shared with everyone, especially our relatives, our children, and neighbors.

My initial inclination to embrace patriotism was instilled in me by my parents and pledging allegiance to the American flag throughout my grade and high school years. My interest also grew for the Air Force, primarily due to flying and aircraft. During my

senior year of high school, I received my draft notice as Vietnam was building up for conflict.

In October of 1962, I enlisted in the Air Force. My first assignment after basic training and tech school was to the 63rd Air Lift Wing in Savannah, Georgia as a reciprocating engine mechanic on C-124 cargo aircraft. TDY was routine as a member of the 63rd supporting missions in Germany, and elsewhere in supporting the Vietnam war. Separation from active duty occurred in the fall of 1966, however my strong sense of serving prompted my joining the Air Force Reserves at Grissom AFB, where I became a crew chief on A37 fighters and later, on KC-135 air refueling tankers for the 434th Air Refueling Wing. As the years passed, promotions occurred, and I was honored to serve as 1st Sergeant and later as the Senior Enlisted Advisor for the 434th Wing. In 1996, my service years ended
